Scripture Passage: 1 Peter 4:7-11 Week of: October 22, 2023

Discussion Questions

- 1. What images does the phrase, "The end of all things is at hand," conjure up in your mind? What does Peter mean by this phrase?
- 2. Why do we find it so difficult to pray? What are the attitudes of mind that often get in the way of prayer?
- 3. What would it look like to pray as if "the end of all things is at hand?"
- 4. How does love "cover a multitude of sins"? What would it look like to love someone who has sinned against you?
- 5. When have you had hospitality extended to you in a way that blessed you and maybe caught you off guard? How can you practice hospitality towards others in your own life?
- 6. Do you find it hard to believe that God has gifted you in a unique way to benefit Redeemer? If so, why?
- 7. Since all Christians are given gifts of the Spirit to serve the church, what might yours be and how could you exercise it? In other words, where do you have a passion and desire for ministry, and where could that bear fruit in the church?
